The Florida Region is made up of 3 countries, Florida – USA, Bermuda, and Trinidad/Tobago. Our region is operating nearly at full capacity with trusted servants including the positions of Facilitator, Co-Facilitator, RD, AD, Secretary, Alt Secretary, Alternate Treasurer, Fellowship Development Leader, Fellowship Development Co-Leader, PR Resource Coordinator, Alternate PR Resource Coordinator, H&I Resource Coordinator, IT Resource Coordinator, Human Resource Panel Leader and four Human Resource Panel members.

Our vacant positions are Treasurer and Corrections Resource Coordinator.

The Florida Region operates by CBDM and is project based through Fellowship Development. At this time, our Areas are on a steady up swing regenerating and revitalizing our groups.

Georgia Region Report

Good morning , First I would like to thank the Florida Region for hosting this event. It was a great learning experience for me. I hope someday our Region can do something for our members like this.

The Georgia region met last weekend in Forsyth. After some consideration we decided to ask the zone to let us host in December of 2025 versus this December. I contacted Matt and it looks like we are all good on that. We have just started the GSR assembly process as of last year and I want to merge the two events when the zone meets. I am hoping to make it a three-day event.

Any ideas or suggestions would be greatly appreciated. As far as how the Region is doing, we just had our convention in Athens that went very well. We voted to change the policy to send 15% of our donation to world to the zonal forum. Now donations from our Region will be automatically generated from the treasurer without having to bring it to the floor.

Our areas seem to remember as well as I do these days. Any time I suggest something about Zone or World there's always one RCM that looks at me with glassy eyes. Hopefully as we move forward with the GSR assembly we will have better informed trusted servants.

North Carolina Regional Report

Greetings trusted servants-

Things proceed well in the NC Region. Our current numbers for active meetings, both in-person and virtual, remain relatively stable. Some groups still struggle with regaining their former attendance prior to the pandemic, which obviously is common across the Fellowship. Our RSC meetings remain hybrid, which we expect to continue doing for the foreseeable future.

We have begun to work on some new PR initiatives with the election of a PR subcommittee chair (finally). We have recently done a presentation for a large program dealing with re-entry for women incarcerated in the state prison system. The presentation went well, and the staff at the local elements of that program have been connected with local service committees. We have also begun working to resume attendance at professional events, having recently coordinated with Carolina Region to table at the NC One Community in Recovery conference. Efforts are being made to explore other professional events we might attend.

IDT workshops have been provided by the delegate team in two of our member areas, and those workshops were well received. We have at least one more area actively requesting a workshop, pending scheduling, and shortly we will be beginning to try and be more proactive in setting these up in the remaining member areas. There is also hope to coordinate several of these workshops with the Carolina Region for the areas that are in Carolina Region while also being in North Carolina rather than South.

In communicating with the local Fellowship, the delegate team continues to post quarterly reports to a blog in the regional website, in the hopes that making this information more available to higher levels of service will increase information flow and involvement in the work at hand.

We look forward to seeing everyone in the Raleigh-Durham area in July, and please let us know if there are additional needs or issues we can help to address.

- GCCNA will be held May 24-May 27. Website is www.gccna.or Gulf Coast. 26 groups 31 in person weekly. H&I commitments are filled. Activities is doing a Capture the Flag event/game. Recently had a West Coast Unity Day that involve all 4 Areas on the west coast.
- Midcoast. 16 meetings. H&I positions are filled. PR posting flyers and presentations MCCNA 24 July 26-July 29.
- North Dade. 26 groups. H&I is active with 1 commitment at the women's jail not currently being held. Peace River. 17 meetings. H&I commitments being filled. Activities is planning a "Recovery Palooza" in the future.

- South Broward. 14 active groups. H&I has 6 facilities currently. March 23th Speaker Meeting 3-4 PM. Information can be found at <https://southbrowardna.org/>, Picnic March30th might be a Gold Coast event Markham Park. April 30th Spring Dance withspeaker at 6:30 and dancing 8-10. SBACNA Convention October 25-27.South Dade. 22 active meetings.
- Sunset Coast. 13 groups with 27 meetings a week. H&I only 1 commitment in men’s jail being filled H&I Subcommittee. Consistent struggles getting members approved to go into jails. 3 book drives with one happening in Gold Coast. April 20.PR Subcommittee. Participated in a Crime Stopper Event. Assisting North Dade Helpline. PR Learning Day for Peace River possibly in June.

Region is under our prudent reserve so no donations to Zone or NAWS. Feb RSC we held a workshop on Fellowship Development. Grateful to the Florida Region for helping introduce FD to the SFR with a presentation/workshop.

TASK TEAM UPDATE

Craig summarize the history of the USMOZ to date.

- o All 8 US Zones first met December 2019 to communicate, collaborate, and work together outside of the World Service Conference.
- o Gathered ideas on possibilities of what we could achieve such as Public Relations, PSA's, national web site, national phoneline, CAR workshops, holiday events, etc.
- o Decided we needed strategic planning, guidelines, and task teams.
- o Accomplished 2020 holiday event, development of Strategic Plan and Guidelines, 2023 CAR Workshop, testing of a national website, and surveys to seek approval from the fellowship.
- o Survey has been out about 2 years and shows substantial consensus support from regions.
- o Recommending that we vote on the following tonight:
 - Approval of US Collaboration
 - Recommend approval of guidelines
 - Recommend election of trusted servants (facilitator, secretary per guidelines)
 - US website funding will be needed.

Proposal #1: Approval of US Collaboration

Initial Vote: 7 YES - 1 PNV - Decision: CONSENSUS

One zone decided to change vote to PNV.

Subsequent Vote: 6 YES - 2 PNV - Decision: CONSENSUS

Zones voting PNV were OK with proposal approval.

Proposal #2: Approval of Guidelines

Initial Vote: 6 YES- 2 PNV - Decision: CONSENSUS

Agreed that modifications could be made later.

Proposal #3: Election of Trusted Servants

Discussion to delay elections to allow the fellowship to submit nominees. Agreed that the Facilitator should be currently active in the USMOZ, and that other positions could be left open.
