Summary

Root Server software is on the latest version, and is running well.

Yap software is running version 3.99. Yap version 4 seems to have stabilized, and we will begin upgrading within the next two weeks. Upgrade is tentatively scheduled for Wednesday, February 23. Upgrading Yap adds much-improved reporting, a feature that has been requested by many service bodies.

Florida region has reported some intermittent twilio errors that we are continuing to investigate. It has been a process of collecting logs, enabling additional logging and metrics, rinse, repeat. Thanks to Michelle from Florida region for forwarding errors to us, and we will continue to investigate these until we get them all figured out. We often can't know about problems until someone reports them to us, so please continue to do so!

Although the server is running well most of the time, it does seem to randomly get sluggish. It may be time to upgrade the memory in the server.

Requests

Our server has grown, and it's time to upgrade its memory. Financial impact is \$5 per month, bringing our monthly DigitalOcean bill to \$11 per month. Given the critical nature of our phone lines, upgrading the Yap software is inherently risky. The only way to validate that we didn't break phone lines down is to call them all before and after we upgrade. We have done our best to find all known Yap phone lines in our server, but we probably missed some. So, we have two asks:

Please send us a list of Yap phone numbers for your regions and areas.

We could use a volunteer or two to help us call all of the phone lines before and after upgrading. Please reach out if you're interested and available next Wednesday, February 23.

Florida Regional RD/AD Report Greetings from the Florida Region. We continue to thrive and recover in the Florida Region. The Florida Region currently has 19 areas on the roll. Covering from Tallahassee eastward to Jacksonville south to Palm Beach and west to Sarasota including the island nations of Bermuda with South Florida's Central Florida Area tucked into the Greater Orlando area. We elected a Regional Alternate Delegate who you all know and helped coordinate this weekend's symposium. Our Region has active Resource Coordinators with PR, H&I, Corrections and IT. Our PR folks have been busy with attending and participating in local conferences and are planning to attend FAADA. We have recently had a "changing of the guard" with the election cycle with our Resource Coordinator elections held in September. Dan is our H&I Resource Coordinator, Terri S. remains our is PR Resource Coordinator and Cindy from Orlando, Alt PR, Michelle C. is our IT Resource Coordinator and Colin H remains our Corrections Coordinator and all-around awesome person who helps out our IT team. Megan was elected secretary of the region and Ezra K. alt. Secretary. Ezra K. along with Colin H. also continues to help with IT. They are available and willing to assist any areas in the zone and beyond. We would also like to thank Ezra and Michelle for their hard work this past weekend with the IT at the Symposium here in Atlanta this weekend. The Florida Regional Convention of Narcotics Anonymous Board is feverously preparing for the 40th Regional Convention "The Masks Must Go" in Orlando. This will happen June 30 to July 3, 2022 at the Rosen Center Hotel. The FRC board is going to investigate also including the ASL interpreter in the Zoom meetings next year so we can offer the speaker meeting to our deaf addicts. FRC board decided with the region's support to continue to support and offer Newcomer packages for people with under 30 days clean. We offered marathon meetings for all those who chose not to register. You can preregister for FRCNA 40 through May of 2022 for a discounted price for registration at www.frcna.com. Our RSO continues to be in a strong financial position even with the thefts of funds and the reduced sales due to the pandemic. We are currently engaged in the legal process but understand the wheels of justice move very slowly and even slower the past 2 years since the pandemic started. The former special worker (non-addict) will be sentenced in the near future. Most of the funds have been recovered and the rest is to be returned as restitution when the sentencing is official. Our current RSO staff led by Kaylee is functioning well but is handicapped as all businesses is with the supply chain at this time being slowed down as is the situation at the WSO. We also have a \$2000.00 donation for the SEZF from the Florida

Region. Ramon and I will be doing ICC workshops throughout the Florida Region. We already have done one virtually for Bermuda last week. All will be Hybrid and on our Regional Wd site.

One last event I would like to mention is the Tampa Funcoast Area for the first time in 4 years will be holding a convention again, "Miracles Beyond Measure" at the Hotel Alba from September 30 to October 2, 2022. There are registration forms and pre-convention, fundraiser Tee-shirts available.

Events

Events referred to in this section include all NA activities conducted either separately or in conjunction with business meetings; and whether held indoors or outdoors. Events provide us with the opportunity to socialize with each other, outside of meetings. This socialization allows us to practice and put to use what we learn in the rooms. Many times, however, there are some members who cannot access the event place – and therefore are denied the ability-natural opportunity to forge deeper relationships ~~associations~~ outside of recovery meetings.

It is necessary to state that there will be events that cannot be made **completely** Additional Needs accessible. In cases such as these, there will be suggestions on how to at least have a setting where socialization can be accessed.

Trusted Servants: The majority of the time, events will be hosted by an Activities Committee or a Committee that is part of an Area, Region or larger. Occasionally it could be by a Home Group. Coordinating with an Additional Needs POC or Additional Needs Committee would be extremely helpful.

Contracts: When making contracts with a venue, keep in mind accessibility. Accessibility is a high consideration regarding the event area, along with bathroom access (including port-a-jons)

Site Selection:

- Parking areas and/or shuttles

- Event Site Support:

Ask if there are adaptive devices available on loan; such as ramps for bowling, verbal description via Bluetooth or recording, etc.)

Programming:

It is important for whatever committee is handling Programming for the event to consider attendees with Additional Needs, and how to make the event as accessible as possible, including:

- Flyers and publicity + registration
- Speakers, entertainment, etc.
- Activities being planned – SEE BELOW

Indoor Events

- Auditorium/screen/stage/performance
- Dinners/Banquets/Restaurants/Coffee shops – Braille/large print menus; proper seating arrangement
- Amusement venues such as arcades, amusement parks, karaoke, etc.
- Dances – how to make them fun for all

Outdoor Events

- Beach + access to the area
- Trail/hike
- Access to picnic decks/gazebos, boardwalks, piers, boats
- Equipment such as bicycles, hayride wagons, etc.
- Swimming pools should have a (lift) – some pools have zero-depth access as well.

Transportation

- Between venues if a large or multi-day business meeting
- Shuttles from parking areas
- Transportation around large spaces such as zoos, parks, etc.

NA Meeting places, in association with business meetings (ex. A “regular” NA meeting is suggested in conjunction with an RSC/ASC, etc.)

ALTERNATIVES

Support: Plan for assistance for those with Additional Needs; for example, helping a person who is blind to negotiate a buffet.

Provide alternate activities that **socially** include the addict with Additional Needs.
