In July, barring objections by the SEZF, we intend to most likely host the zonal meeting online. More will be revealed.

Greetings and salutations,

Our last RSC met last month with 10 of 11 Areas present. It was a hybrid meeting with many of us attending in person as well as virtually. Some notable outcomes. We elected a new Chairperson, and budgets have been submitted to Areas for approval. We had a couple ad-hoc committees come up with role, responsibilities, and guidelines for reviving our SFRCNA (South Florida Regional Convention of Narcotics Anonymous) and a newly formed Policy Subcommittee. There are a couple new motions that been sent out to groups include lowering our prudent reserve from \$21,000 to \$17,000 and lowering our mileage reimbursement from the Federal guideline of .70 to .35 as a way to reduce expenses. Our Region is still recovering from a budget shortfall experienced recently.

As our Region is working to revive our convention, the 4 Areas on the west coast, Sunset, Gulf Coast, Peace River, and Shark Coast, are having meetings discussing the feasibility of having a West Coast Convention. Now that the CAR has been released, Mahdi and I are discussing our plans to bring CAR presentations to the Areas and members of our Region. We have asked Areas to let us know when they would like to invite us to give presentations. There has only been one Area to ask as of yet. We have decided to not wait for invitations and to just show up and make ourselves available. If they want a presentation at that time we will be prepared to do so. We have also discussed having a virtual presentation on a bi-weekly basis. This would be on Zoom on a set date and time so members could make plans to attend one of them for the next 6 months. This idea is still being evaluated. It is our intention to do a better job of bringing our Regions conscience to the Conference.

Historically this has been a challenge with an embarrassing lack of participation from our Regional members. We are planning on offering multiple methods and opportunities for members to vote. Examples being a virtual ballot, paper ballots, and a web based ballot. The sooner we can make these methods and ourselves available, the greater number of members will be informed and prepared to place their votes.

SEZF Budget Adhoc Report

Greetings, Trusted Servants-

At our last meeting, I agreed to head an ad-hoc committee to look at our budget and make some recommendations. The committee met twice, with excellent attendance at the first meeting and very poor attendance at the second. No hard feelings, I know we're all busy and that several people had other commitments. The following is a brief summary of what we were able to figure out regarding the current budget and expenses, and two possible recommendations for moving forward. The spreadsheets with all the calculations are attached, although I know they are a little hard to follow (like my brain), hence this summary.

Obviously our spending is far greater than our income, as at one point there was discussion/a recommendation that each region contribute a certain amount each year. That is irrelevant. It's not happening, and while we can encourage that regions follow through on this, until it does happen it is not prudent to include those numbers.

The spreadsheet breaks all this down with graphs by category (I consolidated some of them, for example trusted servant expenses are now all one category) and compares to income. It is not a pretty picture.

At the current rate, we will be broke sometime in 2026.

Our approximate income is around \$5,400 a year based on the available information. This is the number operated on for the remaining calculations. Predicted out, this would suggest an income of a little over **\$16,000** for a three-year cycle. This is the basis for the recommendations

Those recommendations are:

Option 1.)

Only essential expenses are budgeted for. All other expenses, like PR and Additional Needs, will be voted on. We vote on all those things anyway, so we will need to vote on them individually as they arise. Additionally, this recommendation would include funding for **one** in-person zonal meeting per year. One of those would likely be the CAR workshop; the rest could be decided based on funds. There were also some adjustments to the other line items that were less significant. If this budget were applied, the budgeted expenses would be **\$4,750** for one year or **\$14,250** for three years. The projected income for three years is a little over **\$16,300**. This leaves about **\$2,000** in remaining funds for expenses like PR and ASL translation. The other caveat is that if something is over budget, it does not happen. We cannot have a budget and ignore it. If trusted servant expenses hit their max, they stop traveling unless explicitly voted on by the body, taking current finances into account.

This is the recommended budget for one year and three years. It assumes one in person meeting per year, all other expenses voted on as needed.

Option 2.) Vote on literally everything. The decision of whether the next SEZF meeting is in person is made at the preceding meeting based on how much money is in the bank. All decisions are based on current financial status, and we essentially operate with mostly no budget at all. Sounds crazy, but if you only spend money you know you have, you won't go over budget. The only expenses that would be budgeted for are Zoom, the website, etc., which are standing expenses we cannot avoid. All other travel and projects get voted on as needed.

This is how we get back on track. Until our income changes (which can be emphasized is not really worth spending a lot of time on), this is how we make the books work.

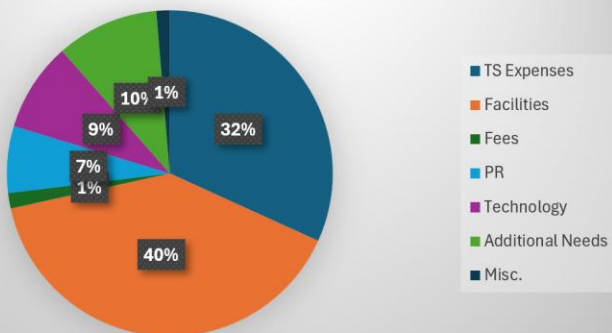

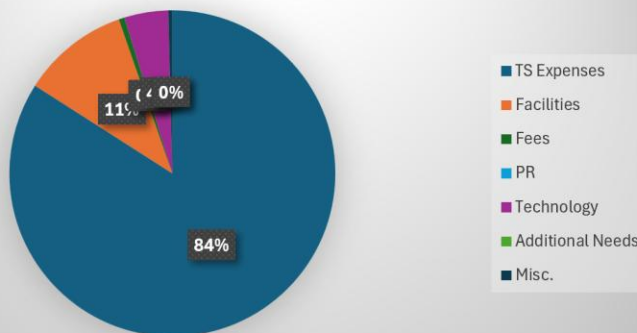
This represents our current 2 year budget

BMLT Task Force Report for November 9, 2025

The BMLT Server was upgraded to and has been running version 4 for several weeks. This is a major rewrite of the user interface, and is more mobile friendly. The BMLT and phone lines are stable and working as expected.

Assistance Provided

- ALNWFL Region had high Twilio bills for their phone line. Worked with them to figure out it was because of excessive use of the SMS meeting search feature. Helped them turn off this feature for a month to reduce usage.
- Someone from Orlando reached out to report the Spanish voice on their helpline wasn't working properly. After investigation, we found it was because an English voice was configured to read Spanish words. We fixed this for them, but were unable to get in touch with them to let them know it was fixed. Please let them know.
- Someone from the Midtown Area in Georgia Region reached out to let us know they were unable to edit meetings. After an extensive back and forth was unable to resolve her problem, we just edited the meetings for her. It was about 50 meetings at the Highland Club that had moved to a new location.

- Several areas worldwide experienced problems with their meeting lists for a few hours around October 19. We figured out this was a problem with a central server hosted by the BMLT Development Team called the Aggregator. We worked with them to figure this out and restore service.

Kentucky Server Migration

This still has not been completed because we have not received the support we need from Bluegrass Appalachia and Kentuckiana regions. Our previous contact there has become unresponsive. To pull this off, we need to coordinate a simultaneous change to all NA websites and phone lines in the state of Kentucky. Ideally, this means we'd have temporary admin access to all of those websites and phone lines. We are still willing to do this work, but need the proper support from those regions.
